The Lillestrøm kommune Response Center is an alert management center linked to home healthcare technologies: it continuously receives signals from devices such as alarm buttons, fall detectors, and monitoring systems, then assesses the situation and coordinates the appropriate response (contacting the individual, dispatching home care services, or alerting emergency responders). This system ensures 24/7 support, enhances the safety of vulnerable individuals, and promotes independent living at home while optimizing the use of healthcare resources.

Dronning Ingrid's Garden is an innovative dementia care facility in Oslo designed as a small "garden village" that enables people with dementia to live as normally and actively as possible. It offers around 130 places in small residential units, with private rooms and bathrooms, and allows residents to move freely within safe indoor and outdoor areas. The site includes shared amenities such as a café, shop, cultural spaces, hair salon, and activity areas, encouraging social interaction and connection with the local community. Care is provided by qualified staff and supported by adapted technologies, with specific provisions for diverse cultural needs, including Sami residents.

Furuset Hageby

Furuset Hageby in Oslo is an innovative dementia village designed to provide lifelike, small-scale living in a secure and community-integrated setting. Comprising 14 households with 8 residents each—including dedicated spaces for younger people with dementia—it features a central village street with a café, shop, hair salon, library, gym, and more, all open to both residents and the local community. The environment includes rooftop gardens, sensory courtyards, and themed walking paths to support safe movement and orientation. Inspired by the Dutch De Hogeweyk model, Furuset Hageby emphasizes normal daily routines, social engagement, and dignity. It is also a model of sustainability, built with eco-friendly materials, green roofs, and energy-efficient systems under FutureBuilt and BREEAM-Excellent standards. Smart care technology further enhances residents' autonomy and safety, making it a pioneering example of dementia care in Norway.

Program changes

If, despite all their efforts, circumstances compel them, Dialog Health and their partners reserve themselves the right to modify the program without consulting the participants, who cannot claim any compensation.

Payment terms

A payment of at least 1,500 € (deposit) must be done at the moment of the registration to secure a place in the delegation.

Delegates may choose between the two payment plans, choosing between one or two invoices.

Full balance is due 30 days before departure.

All invoices will be sent electronically by Dialog Health directly to the email address informed on this registration form.

Dialog Health will be unable to retain registrations and reservations without full payment by the due date.

Cancellation – Incurred cost

The existence of many intermediates and payment terms imposed by them on the trip organizers justified the charging cancellation fees even more important than the date of departure is near (transfer equivalent to cancellation) :

- More than 91 days before departure: 25% of the total amount
- 90 to 61 days before departure: 50% of the total amount
- 60 to 31 days before departure: 75% of the total amount
- Less than 30 days before departure: 100% of the total amount.

However, if cancellation is made a refund may be considered if a replacement delegate is found.

Any amount due to Dialog Health cannot be reported on a future trip.
